OBJECTIVES

FUND AIM

To achieve capital growth and income through investment in UK and international government and corporate bonds. The Fund's performance benchmark is US Cash Indices LIBOR Total Return I month.

INVESTMENT STYLE

The Fund has a highly flexible approach to duration, credit and currency. Fund duration can be reduced to a minimum of -3. In addition the Fund can take short currency positions up to a combined maximum of 20%. Investment decisions are fundamentally driven using a combination of quantitative analysis with qualitative judgement calls. Derivative instruments are also utilised to manage risk.

COMMENTARY

During April the fund (Class A USD) rose 0.2% (including the end month distribution), the benchmark (I month US LIBOR) rose 0.2% and the Citigroup World Government Bond Index fell 1.9%.

Performance in global bond markets was adversely affected by two key drivers – rising yields and a stronger US Dollar. We were pleased to have generated a positive return for the month against these strong headwinds, thanks to our hedges on duration and currency. The fund suffered from its exposure to weak EM currencies such as Peso, Rupee and Real but these were almost all offset by our short Euro and Sterling exposure.

Government bonds were generally weak during the month, led by the US Treasury market where the 10 year benchmark briefly went through the psychologically important 3% level. European Government bonds were weak in sympathy but not down materially. In the UK the fear of Brexit still hangs over the economy and may have started to weaken activity, and in Europe, the effects of a much stronger Euro appear to be slowing activity there too.

The 10 year Treasury bond ended April 9.3% below the high point in July 2016 on a total return basis. More importantly, the drawdown from that peak has now extended to 471 business days which is the longest period of drawdown since December 1979, which is as far back as Thomson Datastream provides the data. Unless yields fall from the end April level of 2.94%, it will take 3 years to accumulate enough return to get back to the 2016 peak. We fear this sensitivity and lopsided profile of returns will come as a surprise to those investors thinking they invested in a safe asset class.

The fund has continued to hedge out almost all duration risk of the underlying Government bond markets while looking for compelling credit issues which can pay good income. In April we invested in a Brazilian electric power generation project which is unusually insured by a Swiss state owned insurance company. We are earning a return of 9.5% in BRL or could decide to hedge it back to USD to receive a net 6% - a compelling return for a bond with a S&P rating of AAA.
